A. Directions to NGS

- NGS headquarter offices are located on the corner of 17th & M Streets NW and occupy a 4-building complex (map attached).
- The meeting will be in our “Staff Auditorium” which is located on the 2nd floor of our M St. building (1600 M St.—the Grosvenor Auditorium on the map. It is easiest to enter the from our court yard on M Street between 17th and 16th Streets. Our Security personnel will direct you to the meeting room on the 2nd floor.
- Parking is available in public lots in the neighborhood, but we recommend that you take Metro. The closest Metro stops are:
 - Farragut West (Orange & Blue lines) – take the 17th St. exit, cross Farragut Square to K St. and proceed north 2 blocks up 17th to M St. Turn right on M St, and go a half block to our courtyard on the right. Cross the courtyard to the entrance of our M St. building on the left side of the courtyard.
 - Farragut North (Red line) – take the L St. exit (this will put you on the corner of L & Connecticut). Go right (east) on L St and cross 17th St. (one block). Turn left up 17th one block to M St.. Turn right on M St a half block to our courtyard on the right. Cross the courtyard to the entrance of our M St. building on the left side of the courtyard.
